Tuesday, January 11 *Virtual River Talk: En-ROADS Climate Simulator Workshop. 7-8:30 pm.* Join MWA for our first River Talk of the new year, a virtual, interactive event where you will learn about the En-ROADS Climate Change Simulator, an online tool that explores possible solutions for climate change. Users create global scenarios by adopting policies in different sectors of society: energy supply, building and industry, transportation, land use, growth, and technological carbon removal. The model is calibrated to research and business climate models and, among other things, it demonstrates interactions among the solutions and the co-benefits of possible policies. The En-ROADS simulator is a terrific teaching tool for preteens to adults that allows for different depths of study. Learn how we can keep global warming below 1.5 degrees Celsius!

Susan Golden is a retired STEM teacher who speaks throughout the Northeast on climate change and other environmental issues such as sustainability, pollution, and water. She has trained with several environmental organizations and completed the Rutgers Environmental Stewardship Program. Susan has created several informative presentations and workshops that she delivers regularly to schools and community groups around the world. In 2020, she became an En-ROADS Ambassador for Climate Interactive (online climate simulator). Additionally, Susan is a member of the Climate Reality Project Leadership Corps and serves on the board of directors for the Hackensack Riverkeeper and the Tenafly Nature Center.
